

Are you a Rhode Island renter looking for assistance with your heating oil and propane expenses?

There are financial resources available through Community Action Programs (CAP) across RI.

CAP agencies administer both the Low Income Home Energy Assistance (LIHEAP) and the Good Neighbor Energy Fund programs. Interested households may apply for either program via a CAP agency serving their community.

LIHEAP

LIHEAP helps keep families warm through the winter by assisting families with energy costs and reducing the severity of energy-related crises. Eligible households must be at or below 60% of RI's Area Median Income (AMI) (*roughly \$64,702 annual household income for a family of four*).

GOOD NEIGHBOR ENERGY FUND

For more than 35 years, the Good Neighbor Energy Fund has provided assistance to Rhode Island households who are unable to meet a current energy expense due to financial difficulty. Eligible households must be at or below 300% of the federal poverty level (*roughly \$79,500 annual household income for a family of four*).

¿Es usted un inquilino de Rhode Island que busca ayuda para sus gastos de gasóleo y propano para la calefacción?

Hay recursos financieros disponibles a través de los Community Action Programs (CAP, Programas de Acción Comunitaria) disponibles en todo el estado.

Las agencias de programas de acción comunitaria administran los programas Low Income Home Energy Assistance (LIHEAP, Asistencia Energética para Hogares de Bajos Ingresos) y Good Neighbor Energy Fund (Fondo de Energía para el Buen Vecino). Los hogares interesados pueden solicitar cualquiera de los dos programas a través de una agencia de los CAP que sirva a su comunidad.

LIHEAP

El LIHEAP ayuda a mantener a las familias en un ambiente cálido durante el invierno, ya que las asiste con los costos de energía y reduce la gravedad de las crisis relacionadas con la energía. Los hogares elegibles deben contar con el 60% o menos del ingreso promedio del área de Rhode Island (aproximadamente \$64,702 de ingresos anuales por hogar para una familia de cuatro integrantes).

GOOD NEIGHBOR ENERGY FUND

Durante más de 35 años, este programa ha proporcionado ayuda a los hogares de Rhode Island que no pueden hacer frente a un gasto energético corriente debido a dificultades financieras. Los hogares elegibles deben estar en o por debajo del 300% del nivel federal de pobreza (aproximadamente \$79,500 de ingresos anuales por hogar para una familia de cuatro personas).
